

Starting 2025 in Year 2, Room 10

The Year 2 students in Room 10 have been working hard to develop their writing skills. At the start of the year, they focused on learning about recount structures and exploring what makes a strong and engaging recount. To put their learning into practice, students walked around the school, visiting the chickens, ninja playground and library. They then used their experiences to write their recount as their final writing for the unit.

In vocabulary lessons, held four times a week, students have been actively building their word knowledge to make their sentences and writing more interesting and provide more information! At the beginning of the year, they learned new vocabulary related to the classroom, music, the beach, Earth, and, most recently, emotions such as sadness. After exploring each set of words, students applied their understanding by using the specific word in meaningful sentences, strengthening their vocabulary and writing skills.
