### Room 26 Update – Sentence Stars and Career Dreams!

Room 26 has had a fantastic week of learning, showing great effort and enthusiasm across all subject areas. One highlight we're especially proud of is our sentence writing!

Our students have made tremendous progress since the start of the year, especially in learning how to write structured, meaningful sentences. In Year One at Nollamara Primary School, we follow an explicit direct instruction model to teach sentence syntax. This week, we focused on subordinating conjunctions, specifically before and after. Students used the sentence stems "Before the blocks fall..." and "After the blocks fall..." to create their own imaginative endings. With a little support for tricky spelling, they came up with some creative and thoughtful sentences!

We also celebrated Occupation Dress-Up Day this week! It was so exciting to see the students dressed as their future selves — from teachers and doctors to police officers, builders, and even a clown or two. The room was buzzing with dreams and possibilities!

This special day encourages students to wear pink—Aishwarya's favourite colour—and join together in a spirit of kindness, compassion, and community.


