## PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

**Dear Families** 

Welcome back to a new semester at Nollamara Primary School. I hope you had a safe and happy break and are ready for the exciting learning ahead.

As we begin this term, we acknowledge the Noongar season of Makuru. This is a time of change and reflection, and it reminds us how important it is to be flexible and resilient—qualities that help us all learn and grow.

At Nollamara PS, our REACH values—Respect, Excellence, Acceptance, Compassion and Honesty—guide the way we work and learn together. When children show these values, everyone can feel safe and do their best learning. We ask for your help in talking about these values at home so children can use them in every part of their lives. When school and families work together, our children succeed.

You can help by looking for moments at home to talk about REACH. For example, praise your child for showing Respect by listening carefully or helping others, or talk compassion. These small conversations make a big difference and help our children understand that these values are important everywhere, not just at school.

This semester started very smoothly, even though many children changed classrooms or teachers. I am very proud of how well the students have managed these changes and how positive they have been. We have an incredibly busy term full of learning and exciting events. ## START AND FINISH TIMES

This is a reminder to our families that the school gates open at 8am in the morning. At this time all children are to go to the undercover area. All of our Education Assistants are there to read with the students and breakfast club is open so they can have something to eat if they are hungry. The bell then goes at 8:30am for the students to go to their classes. Learning officially starts at 8:50. If your children arrive at school later than 8:50am they are LATE and will receive a late notice. PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE try and get your children to school on time! When children arrive late they not only miss valuable learning time but they can feel unsettled that the rest of the class is engaged in learning and they missed the instructions. I love to go to the undercover area in the morning and see the children reading, eating and socialising with each other. It is such an important time for them to transition into their school day.

The school day ends at 2:50pm. If your child is older and can go to the Kiss and Drive pickup area, this is ideal. Alternatively, the children can sit out the front of the school and wait for their parents to collect them. We have staff on duty out the front of the school until 3:15pm. Your child should be collected before this time!

This term, the staff in the office finish their day at 3:30pm and so we are unable to have students waiting in the office after this time. It is parent responsibility to collect their children when school is finished. We are very lucky at Nollamara PS to have Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) on site. TheirCare have relocated to Room 26 in the early childhood area and are open from 6:30am before school and till 6pm after school. Please use their service if you are unable to collect your children. They are able to provide care, food and activities for your child and this is a much safer and preferable option than having them waiting for you for long periods of time after school unsupervised.






## PBS AT NOLLAMARA PRIMARY SCHOOL: WHAT IT PBS AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

PBS is all about Positive Behaviour Supports. At Nollamara we use PBS to empower students to REACH their full potential in a culturally safe and supportive environment. We assist students to do this via our REACH matrix. Our REACH matrix was curated by us to support our students. You would see on ClassDojo that we always reward the students when they are showing our values as outlined in the REACH matrix: Respect, Excellence, Acceptance, Compassion and Honesty.

Through our incorporation of PBS in our day to day teaching it allows our students to be respectful to those around them, builds important social skills, improves academic success and supports their emotional wellbeing. We teach specific values each week through daily lessons to support our students.

## TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATE - TERM 3

At Nollamara Primary School, we are committed to delivering high-quality teaching and providing every student with the support they need to thrive. This term, our focus on targeted intervention, structured programs, and extension opportunities continues to shape a rich learning environment for all.

## **Focused Literacy Intervention**

Literacy remains a major priority across the school. Our staff are continuing to deliver targeted literacy intervention lessons to strengthen students' reading development. Many students are currently engaged in one of our three specialised reading intervention programs:

- MiniLit supporting younger learners with foundational reading skills
- MacqLit assisting older students with reading fluency and comprehension
- Reading Tutor Program providing one-on-one support for students needing more intensive reading assistance

These evidence-based programs are delivered in small groups for more personalised learning. If your child is participating in one of these programs, you will be notified separately.

## Year 1 – Spelling Mastery Commences

We are excited to share that our Year 1 students have now commenced the Spelling Mastery program in their classes this semester. Spelling Mastery uses explicit instruction and systematic strategies to help students develop their spelling skills through a structured sequence of lessons. This approach supports students in building confidence and accuracy in their writing.

## **New Pilot Program: Small Group Tuition**

This term also sees the introduction of a new pilot initiative – Small Group Tuition. This program provides selected students with additional, small-group instruction in Numeracy, delivered by Miss Taylor Mitchell.

The goal of Small Group Tuition is to offer students more focused and responsive learning time to address individual needs and boost progress. Families of participating students will be contacted directly.

## Year 4 PEAC Testing – Tuesday 5 August

A reminder that the Year 4 PEAC (Primary Extension and Challenge) assessment will take place on Tuesday 5 August (Week 3). The assessment identifies students for extension and enrichment opportunities.

Please note:

• If you wish to withdraw your child, please refer to the parent letter sent home last term. This must be initiated by the parent—school staff cannot make this decision.

We look forward to the learning growth and successes of our students throughout Term 3.

## LIBRARY NEWS

Students from year 5 and 6 were treated to a visit from Perth author Chenée Marrapodi and Premier's Reading Challenge mascot "Dewey Dex" on 25 June. Chenée is a WA Ambassador for the Children's Book Council of Australia's 80th anniversary, and part of the Premier's Reading Challenge author cheer squad. Chenée is also currently part of the Channel Nine News team. Students heard about her writing process and especially loved hearing about her writing buddy, Taco the dog! We even did some ballet dancing with Dewey Dex!!

Chenee's book, "One wrong turn" has been nominated for the West Australian Young Readers' Book Award this year. We wish her all the best and hope everyone votes for her book.




## SCIENCE WEEK


