ATTENDANCE

Going to school every day is vitally important so your child does not miss out on important ideas, concepts, knowledge and skills for future learning. At our school, we want your children to do their very best. To get the best education, they need to go to school every day. By working together, our school community can support your child's attendance.

What can you do to help?

- Have a set time for your child to go to bed at night and get up in the morning.
- Have their uniform and school bag ready the night before.
- Have a set time for breakfast or send your children to school at 8am for reading and breakfast club.
- Talk about school positively.
- If running late, encourage your child to still go to school and reassure them that you will let the school know.
- Get involved at school through volunteering or participate in school programs, events or join the Parents and Citizens' Association.

Do you need to let the school know if your child will be away from school?

Yes, you need to let office staff or class teacher know that your child will be absent from school and the reason why as soon as possible. You and do this via our website or ClassDojo. Having information about why a child is missing school helps us plan for their return to school and to work out whether we can provide any further help to you.

Shaping the future

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Our school is changing the way we send messages about student attendance. From Tuesday 12 August, we will use **Compass SMS** to tell you if your child is away from school.

You will get a text message from **Compass**. This message asks you to add an **attendance note** for your child's absence and includes a **one-time link** for you to tell us why your child is away.




The link in the SMS is safe to use. It is part of our school's official system.

How to submit an Attendance Note for your child's absence:

- 1. Click the link in the Compass SMS
- 2. The Compass webpage opens in your browser
- 3. Choose a reason for the absence from the drop-down menu
- 4. Type extra details or comments in the box below.
- Make sure your message is at least 10 characters long.
- 6. Submit the form.

If your message is less than 10 characters, the note will not be sent to the school.



SCIENCE UPDATE FOR TERM 3

Students are studying the wonderful subject of biology this term. They are learning about life and living organisms by exploring the structure, function, growth, evolution, distribution, and taxonomy of all forms of life, from the smallest microorganisms to the largest ecosystems.

Last week, some of the students from Pre-primary and Year 1 went on a 'schoolyard safari' and found all sorts of amazing minibeasts including snails, ants, spiders, bees, moths and lady bugs. Who knew there was so much life thriving in our vegetable gardens?

Next week, we will be celebrating National Science Week. The theme this year is "Decoding the Universe - Exploring the Unknown with Nature's Hidden Language". At school, we will be diving into the tiny world around us using microscopes to explore cool patterns in nature. Students will look closely at things like leaves, shells, feathers and more to discover amazing details we can't see with just our eyes!

I will also be running a school-wide scavenger hunt for every class during their science lesson in week 4. Students who correctly complete the answer sheet will enter the prize-draw to win a family pass to Scitech, the Aquarium of WA or the Perth Zoo. Winning entries will be announced on Tuesday 19th August.


Figure 3 - Students from room 24 looking for mini-beasts.

Come August, it features thousands of events across Australia, from universities to research organisations, schools, museums, libraries and science centres. It's science, supersized – over a million Aussies take part in science events across the nation.

The theme this year is "Decoding The Universe - Exploring the Unknown with Nature's Hidden Language". This theme invites us to delve into the mysteries of the Universe by exploring the fundamental languages of nature, including mathematics and the groundbreaking field of quantum science.

Our Science Teacher extraordinaire, Mrs van der Beeke has provided all teachers with ways to consolidate this in their classes for the week and will be hosting a school-wide scavenger hunt taking place during science lessons in week 4. 


