Dear Nollamara Primary School Community

As we move further into Term 2, I would like to take a moment to celebrate the wonderful learning happening across our school, particularly in reading.

We are currently in the Noongar season of Djeran, which marks the beginning of the cooler weather and is a time of change and reflection. During Djeran, the mornings become cooler, the colours in nature begin to change, and many animals prepare for the wetter months ahead. At Nollamara Primary School, we value opportunities for our students to learn about and connect with Aboriginal culture and the rich knowledge of the Noongar seasons.

I am incredibly proud of our students and the commitment they are showing towards our 200 Days of Reading challenge. We already have many students who have achieved 100 days – and even 150 days – of reading at home. This is an outstanding achievement and reflects the strong partnership between our school and families in supporting student learning.

What is especially exciting is that we are already seeing much stronger participation than at the same time last year. This is a fantastic result and demonstrates the growing importance our community is placing on reading every day.

At Nollamara Primary School, we continue to emphasise a very important message to our students: the more you read, the smarter you get. Reading regularly helps children build vocabulary, improve comprehension, strengthen imagination, and develop confidence across all learning areas. Even just a small amount of reading each day can make a significant difference over time.

Later this term, I will also be participating in my Principal Professional Review. I would like to sincerely thank all parents and families who took the time to complete the survey shared through ClassDojo. Your feedback is greatly valued and plays an important role in supporting both our school and my own professional growth. I am always striving to become a better leader for our amazing school community and remain deeply committed to continual improvement in everything we do at Nollamara Primary School.

Thank you to all families for encouraging and supporting reading at home and for your ongoing partnership with our school. Your involvement plays such an important role in helping our students become successful, confident learners. We look forward to celebrating many more reading milestones throughout the term.

## **SOCIAL MEDIA BAN REMINDER!**

I would like to take this opportunity to again address the importance of online safety for our children.

As many families would now be aware, there is increasing concern across Australia regarding children's access to social media, with new legislation and recommendations focused on restricting access for children under 16 years of age. This reflects growing evidence about the harmful impact social media and unrestricted internet access can have on developing minds.

At Nollamara Primary School, we strongly encourage families to ensure that children are not using devices unsupervised, particularly in private spaces such as bedrooms. The internet can expose children to inappropriate, harmful or distressing content that they may not yet be emotionally ready to process. Even seemingly harmless platforms can quickly expose children to unsuitable material, online bullying, unrealistic expectations and unsafe interactions.

It is also important to remember that primary school students do not generally require unrestricted internet access for homework purposes unless specifically directed by their teacher. We encourage families to prioritise reading, outdoor play, creative activities and face-to-face interactions wherever possible.

Applications such as YouTube, X, Instagram and Facebook are not appropriate for primary-aged children and, in many cases, students are below the minimum legal age required to access these platforms. As adults, we all share a responsibility to help children develop safe, healthy and balanced digital habits.

## NASAL SPRAY FLU VACCINATION CLINIC

We are very excited to advise families that we have booked a free flu vaccination clinic for our students at Nollamara Primary School on Wednesday 3 June and Thursday 4 June.

The vaccine being offered to students is a simple nasal spray vaccine – no needles involved.

Parental consent is required for students to participate; however, parents do not need to attend the clinic with their child.

Families can provide consent by scanning the QR code attached and selecting their preferred appointment time while completing their child's information. Alternatively, parents may complete a paper consent form (on next page) and return it to their child's classroom teacher.

This voluntary program aims to help reduce the spread of influenza within our school community and support student attendance and wellbeing throughout the winter months.


## NOLLAMARA PRIMARY SCHOOL REACH FOCUS

## SCHOOL HOURS

A reminder to parents of the following school times:

7:30am – School office open for phone calls, emails and payments.

8:00am – gates open and students allowed to enter. Lunch orders to be placed at this time unless done online the night before. Parents can stay with their child until the classrooms open if they wish but ALL children are to go to the undercover area until 8:30am. There are staff supervising and reading with the students during this time and they are able to get some free breakfast.

8:30am – bell goes and students go to class. Parents are asked to leave the school grounds

8:50am – instruction begins. Students arriving after this time need to get a late note from the office before going to class

9:00am – all school gates are locked.

**Between 9am and 2:45pm, parents are NOT ALLOWED on school grounds.** If you have been called to collect your child or you need to pick up your child for an appointment, then you need to go to the front office (administration) and your child will meet you there. It is essential that we know who is on our school grounds at all times. Similarly all therapists who are coming to see students during school time MUST sign in at the office and ensure they are expected.

2:45pm – school gates are open and parents can come through to collect their children.

2:50pm – school is finished.

3:00pm – any child who hasn't been collected will be brought to the office and parents contacted.

3:30pm – School office is closed
